

# Human Rights Minor

To receive a minor in Human Rights, a student must complete seven four-unit courses (twenty-eight units): two required courses (HMNR 100 and HMNR 101), and five courses from the list of approved courses at least two of which should be from the list of Core Courses. Since the Human Rights Minor is an interdisciplinary program students are allowed to take no more than three courses in any one department.

Outlines the structure and functioning of the contemporary human rights regime, and then delves into the relationship between selected human rights protections against genocide, torture, enslavement, political persecution, etc. and their violation, from the early Cold War to the present.
