



Welcome to the 2-Pass Enrollment Process video which will explain how to enroll in courses after your first quarter at UC San Diego.




The two-pass enrollment process helps to ensure that all students have the opportunity to enroll in required pre-major, <u>major</u>, and <u>GE</u> courses. You will be assigned enrollment times based on the number of units you have completed. The more units you have, the earlier your enrollment time will be.




In order to enroll in classes, you must first check your assigned enrollment time. You will be able to find this on <u>WebReg</u> during Week 5 of the quarter by logging on to <u>TritonLink</u>.

Once you are logged in, scroll over the "Classes and Enrollment" tab and click "WebReg" from the drop-down menu.




Make sure to select the quarter you want to register for from the drop-down list and press "Go"



To check your enrollment time, click the "Appointment Time" link.


You will receive two enrollment times: one for your first pass and one for your second pass. They are generally spaced about two weeks apart. It's extremely important for you to check your enrollment times because if you do not enroll in classes during your first pass, you will have to wait until second pass to enroll in any classes.

It's a good idea to plan your classes before your enrollment time. To find the classes being offered during a specific quarter, check out the <u>Schedule of Classes</u> link under the "Classes and Enrollment" section of <u>TritonLink</u>. You can also refer to the <u>UC San</u> <u>Diego Catalog</u> and your major's <u>Four-Year Plan</u> to help you decide on courses. Additionally, you may want to meet with an ERC Academic Counselor and/or your major advisor to help you prioritize which classes to enroll in during your first and second pass.



First pass appointment times will have a start and a stop date and time.

During your first pass, you will have a 48-hour window where you may enroll in up to 11.5 units. You may not waitlist a course during your first pass. Again, if you do not enroll in any classes during your first pass, you will have to wait until second pass to enroll in any classes for the following quarter.



During your second pass, you will be able to enroll and waitlist in up to 19.5 units. Keep in mind that you should be enrolled in at least 12 units (not including waitlisted courses) to be considered a full-time student for the quarter. This is especially important for <u>International Students</u>, <u>Student Athletes</u>, if you're receiving any form of <u>Financial Aid</u> including <u>VA Benefits</u>, and/or are <u>living on-campus</u>.
