Today we'll be explaining a useful tool available to you called the Degree Audit, and show you other tools to prepare you for Fall course enrollment.

Let's get started!

## Send Transcripts/IGETC to UCSD Office of Admissions:

Send all test scores, high school transcripts, and college transcripts to UCSD Admissions:

### By MAIL:

### ELECTRONICALLY through:

- Parchment, a safe and secure method of requesting your official transcript(s).
- eTranscriptCA, Credential Solutions, eScripSafe, Scribbles, SCOIR, and National Student Clearinghouse if your academic institution is registered with these e-transcript vendors.

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We'll first begin with discussing transcripts and test scores.

If you sent them AFTER the July 1<sup>st</sup> deadline, you don't need to re-send them but they may be posted late on your academic records.

If you didn't send them at all, you may send them by using one of the methods above. It must be sent directly to the UC San Diego Office of Admissions. Please note that the UCSD Office of Admissions prefers electronic transcripts to expedite processing transfer coursework so we strongly recommend that method if you have the option. Be sure to submit as soon as possible.

# How to Check if Transcripts are RECEIVED:

## OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS RECEIVED

Upon receipt of official transcripts, it can take up to 10 business days before transcripts will display as received below. If you do not see a transcript you ordered as received after allowing processing time, please contact your school to confirm it was sent and if not, re-order the transcript. When we receive an official transcript, the name of the academic institution and the date it was received will display below. If you attended multiple high schools and your high school of graduation has reported your previous institution's coursework and grades on their transcript, we will only indicate your high school of graduation as received.

If you have concerns about receipt of your transcripts, or your name is different on your transcript than your UC application, or the name of your academic institution is not listed, please email us: [receiptoftranscript@ad.ucsd.edu](mailto:receiptoftranscript@ad.ucsd.edu) or contact the Operations Unit at (858) 534-4208 between 12 noon - 4:30 pm PT.

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There is also a specific area where you are check if your official transcripts have been received. Please remember that although your transcript may have been received, it may still be in the process of being evaluated by the Admissions Office but they will try to get your classes posted before enrollment. We will go over later in the presentation about what to do if your classes are not posted by then but are needed for fall enrollment.

## WHAT IS A DEGREE AUDIT?

A digital checklist that displays:

- All requirements needed for graduation
- Courses you have taken and which requirements have been fulfilled
- What courses you still need to complete



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So, what is a degree audit?

Your degree audit is a checklist that displays all requirements needed for graduation. It shows what courses you still need to complete and uses courses you've already taken to show which requirements have been fulfilled.



Click on the "View Audit" button in the middle of the screen to see your degree audit.

We recommend running a new degree audit each time so you are viewing the most updated version.



Here's what a full sample degree audit looks like. Degree audits range from 4 to 6 pages long because it includes your major, General Education, and University requirements. In the next slides we will be reviewing the different sections of the degree audit.

If you've received credit from qualifying test scores or transfer coursework, you will see those reflected on your Degree Audit in addition to your Academic History.

I want to preface this section by informing you that your transfer course work may not be posted until right before you enroll for Fall courses. We encourage getting familiar with the degree audit system and with the other academic tools we will show you today to prepare you for enrollment. Keep checking your degree audit and your Academic History to see if your test scores and transfer coursework have been posted.

We will now take an in-depth look at a degree audit.

At the top of the audit, you'll find:

- Your name and PID
- Your declared major
- Your overall GPA
- And Your Total Units completed and progress towards the 180 unit minimum to graduate

On the left-hand side of each section , you'll see a green OK indicator if you have completed that requirement or a red NO if you still need to complete that requirement. You may also see three blue dots which indicates the requirement is WIP.

You can also see the date and time you requested this audit . Make sure to run a new degree audit to see the most updated version. It refreshes every time you run a new degree audit.

Scrolling down, you'll find your Major requirements section. Here, you can find:

- Your major requirements
- Courses you've already taken or are currently taking towards those requirements. As well as how many courses you need to complete for that requirement
- And course options you can take to meet that requirement

Again, on the left-hand side you'll see **green** Yes or **red** No indicators that tell you whether you have completed that requirement.

If you have any questions regarding your major requirements, you must consult with your [major advisor](#) using the Online Advising system in the New Student Site. We recommend contacting them sooner than later.

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Scrolling further, you'll find your College GE requirements section . Similar to your Major requirements section, here you will find:

- Your GE requirements
- Courses you've already taken or are currently taking towards those requirements
- How many courses you need to complete for that requirement
- And course options you can take to meet that requirement

Depending on if you have a transfer agreement or not, your audit will look a little different.

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If you are Partial IGETC Certified, Partial UC Reciprocity, or Partial GE Certified, your audit will look like this and you will need to complete MMW 121, 122, and the one to two courses missing from your transfer agreement. Your degree audit will list the missing requirements and show you what courses can count towards that area.

Courses you have already used towards your Partial Agreement may not be used again to complete these missing requirements.

Again, you can see your specific transfer agreement at the top of this section.

If your audit looks like this and says “General Transfer Status” at the top of this section, you are considered a General Transfer student. Let's take a look at an example.

For this student, they have some transfer coursework that was approximated to UCSD courses.

Their BIO 111, PSYC 103 and PSYC 102 from Modesto Junior College were approximated to BILD 10, COGS 17, and COGS 14A at UCSD, respectively.

On the degree audit, it shows the approximated classes have completed some of the lower-division Natural Science and Formal Skills requirements for their Psychology major.

<p><b>MUS 1A. Fundamentals of Music A (4)</b> Primarily intended for students without previous musical experience. It introduces music notation and basic music theory topics such as intervals, scales, keys, and chords, as well as basic rhythm skills. <b>Prerequisites:</b> none.</p> <p><b>MUS 2A. Basic Musicianship (4)</b> Primarily intended for music majors. Development of basic skills: perception and notation of pitch and temporal relationships, introduction to functional harmony. Studies in melodic writing. Drills in sight singing, rhythmic reading, and dictation. <b>Prerequisites:</b> passing score on proficiency exam. <b>Must be taken in sequence. Music majors must be concurrently enrolled in Music 2A* (Basic Keyboard)</b></p> <p><b>MUS 4. Introduction to Western Music (4)</b> A brief survey of the history of Western Music from the Middle Ages to the present. Much attention will be paid to the direct experience of listening to music and attendance of concerts. Class consists of lectures, listening labs, and live performances. <b>Prerequisites:</b> none.</p> <p><b>MUS 7. Music, Science, and Computers (4)</b> Exploration of the interactions among music, science, and technology, including the history and current development of science and technology from the perspective of music. <b>Prerequisites:</b> none.</p> <p><b>MUS 8. American Music: Jazz Cultures (4)</b> Jazz is one of the primary foundations for American music in the twentieth and twenty-first centuries. This course highlights the multicultural and international scope of jazz by taking a thematic rather than a chronological approach to the subject, and by highlighting the music and lives of a diverse array of jazz practitioners from around the country and around the world. Students may not receive credit for both MUS 8 and MUS 8CS. <b>Prerequisites:</b> none.</p> <p><b>MUS 13. Worlds of Music (4)</b> Through surveying selected musical traditions and practices from around the world, this course explores the ways in which</p>	<p>Through exercises, competitions, and improvisations, the student actor explores the imagination as the actor's primary resource, and the basic approach to text through action. <b>Prerequisites:</b> none.</p> <p><b>TDDE 1. Introduction to Design for the Theatre (4)</b> A survey of contemporary and historical concepts and practices in the visual arts of the theatre; studies in text analysis, studio processes and technical production; elementary work in design criticism, scale model making, and costume design. A course serving as an introduction to theatre design and production. <b>Prerequisites:</b> none.</p> <p><b>TDMM 1. Introduction to Dance Making (4)</b> Explores the concepts and processes of dance making through creative projects, discussions, and the examination of major dance works. Recommended preparation: No prior dance experience required. Open to all levels. <b>Prerequisites:</b> none.</p> <p><b>TDGE 1. Introduction to Theatre (4)</b> An introduction to fundamental concepts in drama and performance. Students will attend performances and learn about how the theatre functions as an art and as an industry in today's world. <b>Prerequisites:</b> none.</p> <p><b>TDGE 5. A Glimpse into Acting (4)</b> An introductory course on acting fundamentals for students without an acting background. Through analysis of acting on film, students will explore the actor's craft and practice these skills in studio exercises to better understand how an actor approaches a text. <b>Prerequisites:</b> none.</p> <p><b>TDGE 10. Theatre and Film (4)</b> Theatre and film analyzes the essential differences between theatrical and cinematic approaches to drama. Through selected playwright combinations, the course looks at how the director uses actors and the visual languages of the stage and screen to guide and stimulate the audience's response. <b>Prerequisites:</b> none.</p> <p><b>TDGE 11. Great Performances on Film (4)</b> Course examines major accomplishments in screen acting</p>

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## Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Requirement (DEI)

A knowledge of diversity, equity, and inclusion is required of all candidates for a Bachelor's degree who begin their studies at UC San Diego in lower-division standing in Fall 2011 or thereafter, or in upper-division standing in Fall 2013 or thereafter.

### Definition of Terms:

**Diversity** refers to the variety of personal experiences, values, and worldviews that arise from differences of culture and circumstance. Such differences include race, ethnicity, gender, age, religion, language, abilities/disabilities, sexual orientation, socioeconomic status, and geographic region.

**Equity** is the guarantee of fair treatment, access, opportunity, and advancement for all students, faculty, and staff, while at the same time striving to identify and eliminate barriers that have prevented the full participation of marginalized groups.

**Inclusion** is the act of creating environments in which any individual or group can feel welcomed, respected, supported, and valued.
